## MAJOR ROAD WORKS IN WARD – DISRUPTION LIKELY

Work is planned to start at the Blackfriars junction on the North / South cycle super highway on Monday 3 August. Preliminary works on the riverside near Blackfriars for the Thames Tideway Tunnel is also planned to start at the end of July. The City of London's Department for the Built Environment is meeting both parties together every fortnight to ensure that their programmes are coordinated. The Ward may though experience some disruption as a result.

## PLOUGH PLACE AND FOOTWAYS SURROUNDING 12-14 NEW FETTER LANE

Work has just started on footway works surrounding 12-14 New Fetter Lane (the new Bird & Bird building). Phase 1 of the works will see improvements to the footways around the building itself, these works are due to be completed by October 2015. Phase 2 will see the establishment of a high quality landscaped area in Plough Place, linking Fetter Lane with New Fetter Lane, with trees, hedges and seating areas and new lighting. York stone will be used throughout. This phase of the work will commence on practical completion of the building and will take five months to complete. Existing motorcycle bays will be re-located to Holborn.

## NEW MIXED SCHEME DEVELOPMENT IN THE WARD – DECISION

Last September we reported from a meeting we had requested with the developers of a potential new mixed development of the site encompassing buildings situated on 150-151 Fleet Street, 2-3 Hind Court, 1-3 & 3A Bolt Court and 11 Gough Square. We outlined our concerns and they took our points on board. We requested feedback recently and were told that following meetings with conservation and planning officers, the final decision was taken not to go ahead with the scheme, as the requirement to replace the existing office floor space with new office floor space could not be met by the developers. Ilchester Estate who owns the properties has decided not to proceed for the time being. We will keep you posted of any changes to this decision.

## SCULPTURE IN THE CITY

The popular free public art exhibition, **Sculpture in the City** is back with an eclectic selection of contemporary art pieces located in the Square Mile. Set amongst London's iconic architectural landmarks, such as the Gherkin, Leadenhall Market and the Lloyd's building. The exhibition comprises 12 works from internationally renowned artists including Damien Hurst and Ai Weiwei (from September). In its fifth year, Sculpture in the City aims to enhance our urban environment with cutting-edge contemporary works from leading artists sited in both busy thoroughfares and quieter, green spaces.

The best time to see the pieces is early evenings or weekends when the streets are less crowded.

### FURTHER WORK AT BLACKFRIARS STATION – CLOSURE OF TICKET OFFICE

### CHANGES AT ST ANDREW BY THE WARDROBE

Ward resident the Venerable Rachel Treweek has been consecrated as Bishop of Gloucester. As first female diocesan bishop in the Church of England this means that she will also become the first female bishop to enter the House of Lords. As a result Rachel and her husband Guy, the Priest in Charge of St Andrew by the Wardrobe, will be moving to Gloucester, though Guy will continue to work in the parish on the social projects previously reported in this newsletter, and in particular “Clean for Good”, the new cleaning agency operating as a social enterprise from within the ward.

The new Priest in Charge of St Andrew by the Wardrobe is to be Fr Luke Miller. Fr Luke is moving to become Archdeacon of London with responsibility for the Cities of Westminster and London. He has been Archdeacon of Hampstead since 2010, and before that was Vicar of St Mary’s Tottenham. Fr Luke is interested in education and will become the Chairman of the London Diocesan Board for Schools next year. He chairs the Faith Sector Panel of the London Resilience Board and is to become London Area Chaplain to the Sea Cadet Corps. **For more on Fr Luke and his family, see our website, <http://castle-baynard.org.uk/>**
