ROUGH SLEEPERS IN CASTLE BAYNARD WARD

MULTI-AGENCY OPERATION RESOLVES WARD SITE ISSUES

The Lord Mayor's Show | Sat 9 Nov

On Saturday 9 November, the Lord Mayor's Show, a three-mile-long procession, dating back more than 800 years, and one of the nation's most spectacular events involving some 6,500 participants, 70 floats, 20 military and civilian bands, business floats, community groups and charities, will make its way from Mansion House, and through the ward up Fleet Street towards Royal Courts of Justice. Rough sleeping has increased across Greater London as well as the Square Mile, and Castle Baynard Street in the ward has been the site of a rough sleeping encampment which, in recent months, has grown significantly to over 20 tents. Our commissioned outreach services have been visiting the site regularly to assist and engage with the occupants. Following a serious incident on Wednesday 18 September, resulting in the injury and hospitalisation of one of the occupants, it became apparent that safety at the site had deteriorated. Many of those who were previously resisting offers of assistance changed their minds and we were able to place them in emergency accommodation.

On Thursday 10 October, City of London officers along with a wider group of partners carried out a multi-agency operation to improve the safety and cleanliness of the site. Officers from the Homelessness and Rough Sleeping Team were joined by colleagues from Parks and Open Spaces, Cleansing, City of London Police and Thames Reach. Outreach workers clearly communicated the plans to the owners of the tents in the days prior to the operation. Any abandoned tents were removed to safe storage from where they can be retrieved by their owners if they wish. The number of tents is now greatly reduced, and the cleanliness of the area much improved.

Ward councillor Henrika Priest, who sits on the Rough Sleepers & Homelessness Sub-Committee, commented that the commissioned outreach services visit rough sleepers every day across the Square Mile to work through complex issues to secure lasting solutions. She emphasised that it's vital therefore to report anyone seen sleeping rough immediately via https://thestreetlink.org.uk/, or in complex cases to contact us directly.
